Reconciliation in Iraq Finding Solutions to the Disputes in the North

The various communities of Northern Iraq have differing views for the future of the region. Could the 2010 election result provide new impetus for reconciliation?

Representatives from the Mandaean, Shabak, Yezidi, Chaldo-Assyrian, Turkmen, Kurdish, and Arabic communities, as well as MEPs from the Subcommittee on Human Rights and the Delegation for Relations with Iraq will discuss this issue.

The conference will provide a platform for policymakers from the ethnic and religious communities of Northern Iraq to voice their opinions and concerns on future policies. Efforts will be made to identify a way forward consistent with the principles of democracy, human rights and the genuine inclusion of all affected communities in the region. These are principles without which a stable Iraq will inevitably remain illusive.

The conference is organized by the Iraqi Turkmen Human Rights Research Foundation (SOITM), in collaboration with the Unrepresented Nations and Peoples Organization (UNPO), in partnership with the Group of the Progressive Alliance of Socialists and Democrats (S&D) in the European Parliament, with support from the Turkmen Rights Association of Kerkuk.
